Aftermath of cyclone “MORA”
31st May, 2017

A. Situation Report

The cyclonic, “MORA” accompanied by heavy showers and gusty winds have affected the states of Manipur and Mizoram in North-Eastern part of India causing flash flood and triggering landslides. Damages to houses and infrastructure were reported. However, it did not cause any human casualty.

Mizoram:

- 20 houses were partially damaged at Khawbung village bordering Myanmar of Champhai district
- 10 houses including a church have been also been damaged in Serchhip district
- District hospital roof has been blown away in Siaha district.
- Uprooted tree damaged a pastor's bungalow in south Mizoram's Serkawn village, the headquarters of the Baptist Church of Mizoram.

C. Humanitarian Response:

Government Response:

Manipur

- Rice and dal have been distributed to the affected community by respective district administration.
- District administration is closely working in coordination with IFCD, police and BRTF etc. on places where river water is breaching and clearance of road on landslide affected areas.
- State Government has declared official Half Holiday on 31st May, 2017 from 2pm onward for all Government Offices and Educational Institutions including Public Sector Undertaking/Cooperation's Bodies in Manipur due to sudden flash flood.

Mizoram

- Disaster Management and Rehabilitation department with concerned district authorities have cleared most of the road traffic caused by heavy rain triggered by landslide.
- People were informed to take precaution as the cyclone could trigger massive landslides and flash floods in the state

Humanitarians Response:

- Sphere India, State IAGs is closely monitoring the situation in coordination with respective State Disaster Management Authorities and concerned department.
