SITUATION IN INDIA

The floods situation in Gujarat, Odisha, Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Mizoram are back to normal whereas floods situation in Assam has gradually improved, the numbers of affected districts has drop to nine on 23rd July, 2017.

Meanwhile, two people died as incessant rainfall caused flood-like situation in Birbhum, West Mindapore and East Midnapore districts of West Bengal on Sunday.

A. SITUATION REPORTS :

1. Floods Situation in Gujarat as on 24th July, 2017

The flood-like situation in Gujarat has claimed three lives so far while evacuation operations are underway in several parts of the state by NDRF as the India Meteorological Department has predicted heavy rainfall in the next 48 hours. The rain has hit bus and rail services due to waterlogging in many connecting routes.

No. of District Affected:	Rajkot, Surendranagar, Banaskantha, Sabarkantha and Ahmedabad, Valsad, Morbi, Amreli, Rajkot, Kutch, Mehsana, Valsad and Surat
No. of People Evacuated:	Nearly 7,000 people

Government Response:

- Nearly 7,000 people have been shifted to safer places by NDRF personal.
- Food packets are being distributed at temporary organized relief camps.
- IAF choppers have been on standby to rescue people stranded in flood-hit areas
- Port warning has been issued along the coast and fishermen have been asked not to venture into the sea in the next few days.

Humanitarians Response:

- Inter-Agency Groups-Gujarat is closely monitoring the situation in coordination with Districts Administration.

2. Floods Situation in Odisha as on 24th July, 2017

The Special Relief Commissioner, State Government of Odisha on Sunday alerted the District Collectors of six districts in view of IMD forecast of extremely heavy rainfall in the next 48 hours, which may trigger flood in the Baitarani, Subarnarekha, Budhabalanga and Brahmani rivers.

The six are Keonjhar, Jajpur, Bhadrak, Balasore, Mayurbhanj and Sundargarh.

According to India Metrological Department, heavy to very heavy rainfall is also expected in few places of other districts like Bhadrak, Angul, Deogarh, Sambalpur, Jharsuguda, Dhenkanal, Bargarh and Sonapur.

The district collectors have been asked to remain in full preparedness to face any eventuality and ensure that field officials are in their respective position

3. Floods Situation in West Bengal as on 24th July, 2017

Southern Districts of West Bengal namely – South 24 Parganas, North 24 Parganas, East Medinipur, Hooghly, Howrah, West Medinipur, Birbhum, West Burdwan and East Burdwan are experiencing Heavy Rainfall since 21st July, 2017. Many low laying areas of Southern Bengal are now under water.

On 22nd July 2017 evening IMD updated through its weather inference that “The upper air cyclonic circulation over south Bangladesh and Gangetic West Bengal & north Bay of Bengal extending upto 7.6 Km above mean sea level persists. Under its influence a low-pressure area likely to develop over same area during next 48 hours.”

4. Floods Situation in Assam and others North East States as on 24th July, 2017

The floods situation in Assam has improved in past few days with no. of affected districts has drop to nine districts as on 23rd July, 2017. Similarly, floods situation in Manipur, Mizoram, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh has almost back to normal.

The central government has approved Rs. 132 crore for Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland as assistance for flash floods and landslides that occurred during 2016-17.
