

## Situation Report -1: Floods in Manipur

### 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2017

#### A. Situation Report

Natural Calamities like floods and landslides has affected the State of Manipur for past two month. The State was hit by Cyclone “ MORA” accompanied by heavy rainfall and windstorms on month of May, 2017 causing floods and landslides that led to huge damage to property, infrastructures, paddy field and loss of lives.

Recently, torrential rain triggers by flash flood in many parts of Manipur affected many areas in the valley and the state capital again. Breaches of embankment in many places along river bank were reported. Peoples were left homeless with no adequate foods and drinking water.

#### C. Humanitarian Response:

##### Government Response:

- The State Government declared the current disaster as “STATE CALAMITY”.
- State Government has sanctioned 12 thousand metric tonnes of rice which will be openly available in the market.
- Government has announced to provide short duration paddy variety called RCM 12 which can be reaped within 3 months to the floods affected framers.

##### Humanitarians Response:

- CASA conducted spot assessment in the Imphal East District.
- IGSSS, OXFAM India and DSSS is planning for spot assessment in the affected districts.
- IAG-Manipur Core Group has call for an, ‘Floods Emergency Coordination Meeting” at DSSS on 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 to take stock of current floods situation and plan next of action.
- IAG-Manipur and Sphere India is closely monitoring the current situation in closed coordination with local networks and concerned government department.

## D. Emerging Needs

- Shelter and Household items (Tarpaulin sheets, Floor mates, Kitchen Utensils, Emergency Solar Lamps, Hygiene kits and Dignity Kits)
- Bleaching powders and water purification tablets
- Foods items
- Trauma counseling/ psychological support ( medicines and Doctors)
- Temporary Toilets.
