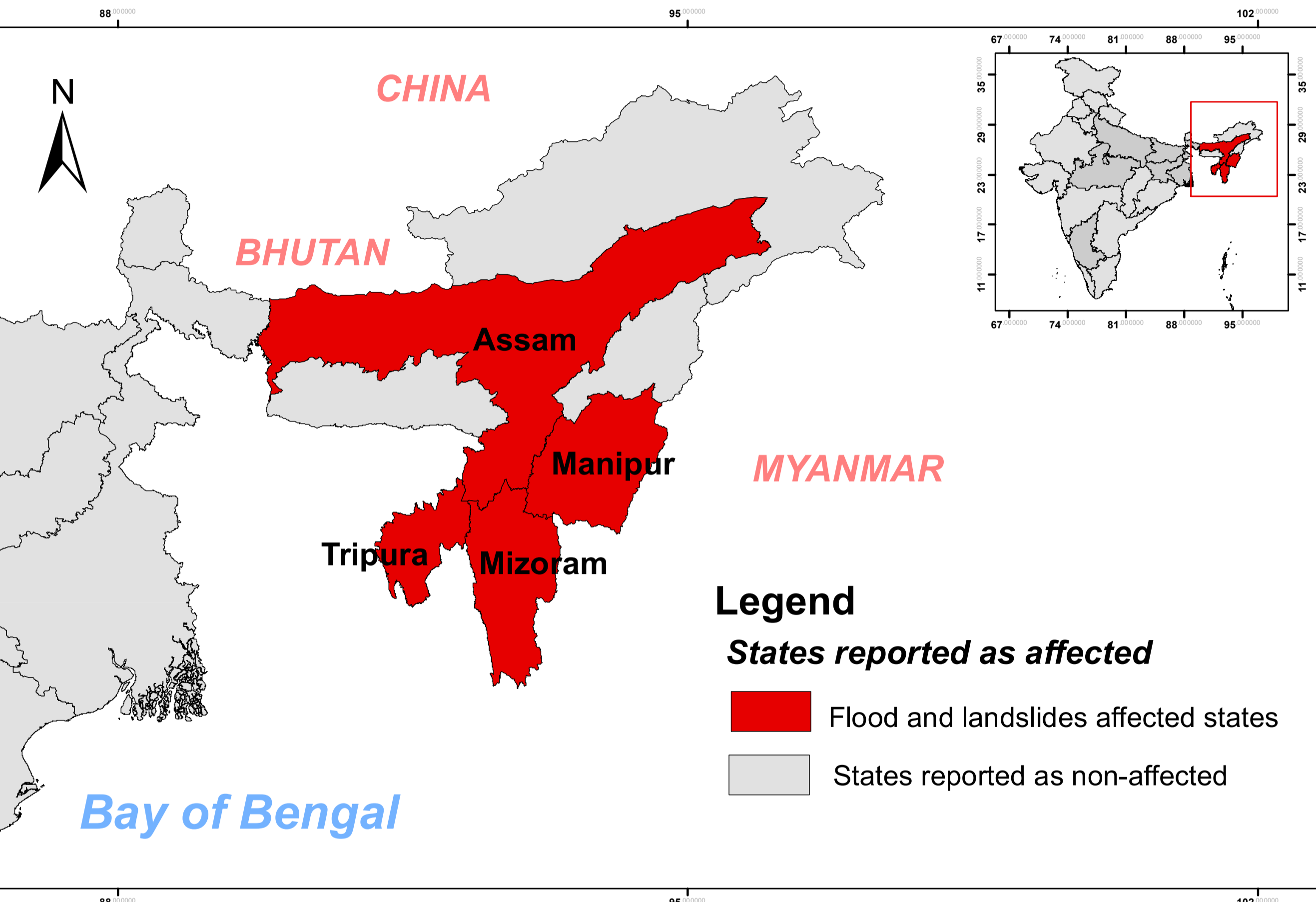


A. Current Situation

Torrential rains over the past few days have triggered flash floods and landslides, wreaking havoc in the states of Assam, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura. The situation worsened in Assam, Tripura and Manipur as many were left homeless and roads were washed away in many parts of the state. The detailed information on humanitarian snapshot report is given below.

1. Assam

Nearly four lakh people have been affected across seven districts of Assam as on 15th June 2018. According to the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA), 3.87 lakh people have been affected in Hojai, Karbi Anglong East, Karbi Anglong West, Golaghat, Karimganj, Hailakandi and Cachar districts in the first wave of floods.

2. Manipur

As per Relief & Disaster Management Department (GoM) report, over 1.8 lakh people were affected in 218 villages of 05 districts in the valley area of Manipur, namely Imphal East, Imphal West, Thoubal, Bishnupur and Kakching. 22,624 houses damaged and 06 precious lives lost due to the prevailing flood in the State (ex-gratia of Rs.5 lakh each has been announced). 149 Relief camps opened with 32,591 inmates. Relief measures going on round the clock. 49,494 persons have been evacuated to safer places by SDRF, State Police Force, CRPF and J & K Rifle (Army).

3. Mizoram

In Mizoram, more than 1,066 families had been affected by flash floods and landslides in four districts. Affected population were evacuated to safer places in two of the worst affected districts – Lunglei and Aizawl. In Lunglei district's Tlabung town and its surrounding, villages homes were inundated by flooding of Chhimtuipui river along the Mizoram-Bangladesh border.

4. Tripura

The flood situation continues to be grim in Tripura. The rain also triggered landslides – 11 in Khowai district, 01 in Gomati district and 05 in Dhalai district. All eight districts in the state are reportedly flooded. Nearly 10,000 people (till 10 am on 13th June, 2018) have taken shelter in 76 relief camps across the state. Two people, including a child, were reported to be death.

C. Government Response

*NDRF, SDRF and State Police Force teams have been deployed for search and rescue work.

* 24 X 7 Helpline number (Health Dept. GoM) - 9856279468, 9856236126, 9863376188, 7005755074 disseminated to public using TV, Social media(WhatsApp) and Radio in Manipur.

* The State government had declared a 02-day holiday in Mizoram and 03days in Manipur (13-15th June, 2018).

* District administration is monitoring the flood situation and providing relief material to the affected people in relief camps.

* NDMA - Dos and Don'ts during floods were disseminated to public.

*IMD has been issuing regular bulletin and alerts.

D. Humanitarian Response by Non Govt. Organisations

*Inter-Agency Groups in the respective states is closely monitoring the situation in coordination with concerned departments.

* IAG member in the respective state and Sphere members have already moved to the field in affected areas for needs assessment and planning for response.

* IAG- Manipur emergency coordination meeting held on 16th June, 2018 at DSSS to take stock of current flood situation.
